

Tire/Box Rack Installation

Instructions

P/N 210716: 2013+ Dodge Promaster Rear Door Tire/Box, Driver's Side

Before you begin:

- Stainless steel hardware may bind together when tightening apply an anti-seize assembly lubricant to the threads of each bolt before assembly
- This installation requires two or more people
- This installation requires the license plate and license plate light to be relocated. Electrical connections must be made – Professional Installation Required


Required Tools:

- Standard and metric wrench set
- Standard and metric socket set
- Standard/Metric Allen Keys or Hex Sockets
- Torx bit set
- Breaker bar (Strongly advised not to use an impact gun)
- Tin-snips or Heavy Duty Cutting Pliers (For cutting weather stripping)
- Isopropyl Alcohol
- Baby Soap or Dish Soap
- Spray Bottle
- Clean Rag
- Squeegee (or old credit card)
- Vise grips
- Door panel plastic rivet puller or Flat Head Screw Driver
- Scissor/Floor Jack (Optional, for supporting door)







Pre-install Prep:

- Cut the supplied protective tape into one 4.5" section, one - 3" section, and one -7" section. Round all corners.
- 2. Apply the protective tape to each location, one at a time, using the following wet application technique described below.
- 3. Prepare the surface for protective film application (wet application technique):
 - a. Clean the area around each hinge with isopropyl alcohol and rag.
 - b. Wash your hands thoroughly.
 - c. Do not apply in direct sunlight
 - d. Apply in temperatures above 60°F.
 - e. Create two separate wetting solutions:
 - i. Soap/water: ~95% water / ~5% soap
 - ii. Alcohol/water: ~75% water, ~25% isopropyl alcohol
- 4. Spray the surface thoroughly with soap/water solution and do <u>not</u> wipe down surface.
- 5. Remove the liner from the protective tape while spraying the <u>adhesive side</u> with soap/water solution.
- Apply the protective tape to the outside of the door (Figure 1). At the upper and lower hinge location, leaving approximately ½" of tape overhanging to be wrapped around the edge of the door. Leave the tape overhanging for now.

- 7. Use squeegee all air bubbles out starting at adhered edge.
- Use the alcohol/water solution to speed up adhesion at one edge (lift section up and spray adhesive side) as needed.
- 9. Wrap remaining protective tape around the door underneath hinge if possible.

Upper Bracket Installation:

- 10. Install the upper hinge bracket by:
 - a. Support the weight of the door by using a floor/scissor jack/piece of wood or recruit a helper to assist. (Figure 2)

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b. Remove the two bolts connecting the upper hinge to the door. (Figure 3)

c. Rotate hinge to allow the bracket to be installed around the hinge (Figure 4).

d. Install the bracket around the hinge in the correct orientation (Figure 5).

e. Swing hinge and bracket back into position against the door. (Figure 6)

f. Confirm that bracket clears the rear door glass (*if applicable*) and use the factory hardware to reinstall the hinge/bracket (Figure 7).

PRO TIP: Be sure to center the bracket around the hinge and verify clearances around the hinge while slowly opening and closing the door.

Lower Bracket Installation:




Figure 9: Inside View of Installed Lower Hinge Bracket

11. Install the lower hinge bracket by repeating the process detailed in Step 10. Be advised that one of three factory bolts will need to be replaced



with supplied M8 counter sunk bolt. (Reference Figure 8 and 9).

Inner Bracket Installation:

- 12. Loosen the weather-stripping on the inside of the driver's side door starting from the top and peel towards bottom of the door.
- Remove the driver's side inside handle by removing the factory socket head bolt (See Figure 10).

14. Hold lever mounting post with clamp or vice during the installation to prevent the latch falling into the door (Figure 11). Once clamped remove the two factory torx screws.

 Install the inner driver door bracket using the supplied M6-1X16mm hardware. (See Figure 12).

- 16. Reinstall the inside door handle over the bracket using the factory bolt.
- 17. Verify the inside door handle operates as desired. Repeat Steps 16-17 as needed.




Figure 13: Weather-Stripping Cut to Shape

18. Reinstall weather stripping over installed inner bracket and mark where strip overlaps bracket. Peel back weather-stripping again and proceed to cut marked region to fit around inner door bracket. (Refer to figure 13 and 14) On the weather-stripping, cut the channel (attachment to the folded sheet metal) and not the bulb (hollow tube).

(619) 449-9930 19. Reinstall weather-stripping over the bracket ensuring cut section lines up with bracket as shown in figure 15.

- 20. Loosely install the rack onto the upper, lower, and inner brackets using the provided 5/16"-18 bolts, washers, and nuts.
 - a. Tighten the upper and lower hinge brackets first.




Figure 16: Installed Weather Stripping After Modification

 - b. There should be a small gap at the center bracket before tightening (0-1/8"). If the gap is larger than 1/8", use the provided 1/8" washers as shims (PN 70448) to close the gap to ≤ 1/8" (See Figure 16).

21. Verify the hinge brackets and inner door brackets have appropriate clearances while slowly opening and closing both rear doors.

Door Stop Installation:

22. Install Door Stop Channel Bracket [PN 350688] into factory threaded holes on the inside of the rear door trim using two M6-1X16mm Button Head screws. (Figure 17 and Parts List)

23. Remove plug grommet on door (*if applicable*) to expose mounting point.(Figure 18)

24. Partially remove door panel cover by carefully prying out push fasteners. This will give you access to the back of the mounting point. (See Figure 19)

PRO TIP: A door panel rivet puller like the one shown below makes this part of the install a breeze. A flathead screwdriver with some protective tape wrapped around the blade will work also.




Figure 22: Door Stop Anchor Hardware

25. Thread webbing anchor into door strap and mount webbing anchor as shown in figure 21 and 22.

 Thread other side of door stop strap into bracket installed on STEP 22 using ¼-20x3" bolt and ¼-20 nylock nut. (Figure 22) Refer to Figure 23 for complete door stop install.





Figure 24: Complete Door Stop Install

27. Reinstall plastic door panel from Step 24.



License Plate Mount Installation:

28. Gather hardware to mount license plate mount. Remove license plate from vehicle and set aside. (Refer to Figure 24 and parts list)




Figure 26: License Plate Mount Installation

29. Partially assemble license plate mount without nuts and washers. Wrap clamps around pipe and grasp firmly together. Insert bolts/washers/nuts and hand-tighten nuts onto screws. (See figure 26)

- 30. Verify that position is correct. Proceed to tighten nuts.
- 31. Install license plate onto mount using (70060)¼-20 bolts and ¼-20 Nylock washers.

32. For bolt-on LED wiring (PN 400508), please consult a certified automotive electrician to perform installation.

Tire Rack Installation:

- 33. Install your vans Aluminess Rear Door Ladder per the separately provided installation instructions.
- 34. Loosely install the bolt-on tire/box supports onto the bottom crossmember of the rack as shown in Figure 1.

35. Starting with support closest to tail light – sliding support as close to the tail light as possible and then rotate into desired position and tighten.





Figure 2: Suggested Orientation for Tire (a) and Box (b)

PRO TIP: Reference Figure 2 for suggested mounting orientation.

- 36. Repeat for the support opposite the center post, being sure that the spacing is equal from the center post, and the orientation is the same for both supports.
- Loosely fasten the Tire Mount Bracket to the slotted channel using the 3/8" carriage head bolts, washer, and nuts to mount. Reference Figure 3.

- 38. Place the mounting bracket in the correct location by placing your tire on the tire supports and then adjusting the bracket vertically until the center hub aligns with the center of the bracket.
- 39. Once the bracket is in place remove the tire and tighten the hardware holding the bracket in place.




Figure 4: Wheel Wedge Assembly








Figure 5: Tire Mount Assembled

- 40. Place the tire on the support stands and mount the wheel wedge, using the 5" hex head bolt, washer and star washer. Reference Figure 4 and 5.
 NOTE: Do not overtighten this bolt. If the security plate does not fit in step 9, you must loosen the hex head bolt.

41. [Optional] If desired, you can mount a Rotopax to the wheel wedge. Before installing the cover [Step 10] first, bolt the rotopax mount to the wheel wedge using the security bolts [70478], as shown below in figure 6. Then simply install the rotopax onto the mount. The cover will not be used if using the rotopax mount. 42. Once everything is securely fastened, bolt the cover to the wheel wedge using the included special bit [70479], and bolts [70478]. Reference Figure 6.




Figure 7: Wheel Wedge Cover Mounting

- 43. Check mounting hardware after first 100 miles of driving and periodically after to verify hardware has not become loose from vibration.
- 44. Your new Aluminess tire rack is now installed, enjoy!
